For all of us involved in the production, dissemination, teaching, and appraisal of culture broadly writ, 2021 was not the return to normal that we had desired. Volume 25 of this journal is a testament to the dedication to the advancement of knowledge under difficult circumstances.

The main section of the journal contains five essays. Eva Karene Romero has curated the artwork for this issue and written the short introduction to the artist’s work. Nuria Morgado continues to assemble our book review section. Thanks to both for their continued commitment to this publication. They along with the members of the editorial board and those who work in other editorial capacities have insured that the journal has been able to continue to function though these difficult times. My sincerest thanks to Assistant Editor Romy Cerón Canché and Managing Editor Agustín Cuadrado for their efforts to assure that we have been able to publish these last two issues.

All of us who work on this publication remained humbled that it has been able to flourish for so many years because of your involvement as readers or contributors. We hope to remain what we have aspired to be from the journal’s inception, a destination for restive spirits, young and not so young, who need a home for scholarship that tears at and redefines disciplinary boundaries.
